

Alpine Flowers Keeping the Ancient Appearance Alive Volcanic Land That Can't Help Changing

Bandai-Asahi National Park is the second largest national park in Japan, with a vast area including Dewasanzan, Asahi Mountain Range, Iide Mountain Range, Azuma Mountain Range, Mt. Bandai, and Lake Inawashiro.

Dewasanzan is well-known as a place of mountain worship and has much historical charm.

The primitive natural environment remains in the Iide and Asahi Mountain Ranges, and the mountain landscape surrounded by majestic mountains can be appreciated. Flower fields at the end of a long approach are filled with a feeling of warmth.

The vicinity of the Azuma Mountain Range and Mt. Bandai has stunning views of the powerful landscape formed by volcanoes, and the beautiful vibrant scenery of various lakes, swamps and forests.

In addition, it has convenient access from the urban area, and many people visit for a wide range of recreation such as mountaineering, natural observation, hot springs, skiing,

The Bandai-Asahi National Park has plenty of appeals, including deep forests and mountains, dynamic volcanic areas, lavish lakes and swamps, and mountain worship which has been passed down for generations.

In addition, a number of climbers and mountaineers visit the park since various mountains in this massive park area can be appreciated by novice climbers as well as experienced mountaineers.

- Conservation Activity of lide and Asahi Areas -In Iide and Asahi Mountain Ranges, conservation activities such as vegetation restoration have been conducted in order to restore nature devastated by human impact and permanently maintain the primitive nature of both areas.

- Invasive Alien Plant Strategy -

The Banda-Asahi National Park has confirmed the invasion of alien plants such as recognized Invasive Alien Species: the cutleaf coneflower and the common dandelion. Currently, removal work is being conducted on the cutleaf coneflower in Urabandai and Joudodaira and on the common dandelion in the alpine zone of Mt. Gassan.

- Oguninuma Pond Limited Passenger Car Access -Access to Oguninuma Pond by car is regulated from the mid-June to the mid-July because of increased traffic of private passenger vehicles during the season of the Japanese azalea and Hemerocallis esculenta.

Shuttle bus (fare required) is operated by the Council as alternative transportation.

- Park Volunteer Activity -

Volunteers are active in the Urabandai and Haguro areas providing nature interpretation to visitors, beautifying and cleaning the park, and conducting natural environment survey, etc.

In addition, they hold events mainly at the visitor centers to educate the public in such areas as nature observation and snowshoe trekking.







National Parks Etiquette

Please keep in mind the importance of nature and observe the following while staying in the national park so that everyone can enjoy.



Do not litter.



Do not pick plants.



Do not feed any wildlife.



Do not catch/capture any wildlife.



No smoking is permitted while walking.



Bonfires shall be built within the designated area only.



Facilities in the national park have been built using the natural terrain conditions Be careful of injuries and use each park facility such as paths and trails at your own risk.



The Bandai-Asahi National Park is a home of the Asian black bear. Pay attention not to encounter a bear



unexpectedly to avoid accidents. There is no lavatory at the summit or on the



mountain trails of Mt. Bandai. Make sure to use the lavatory prior to climbing. In addition, portable toilets can be purchased at Kobo-Shimizu mountain rest huts (Kobo-Shimizu-Goya and Okabe-Goya). Each rest hut is equipped with one portable toilet

- Terrain and Geological Features -

In addition, Mt. Bandai had phreatic eruptions repeatedly, and debris avalanches dammed the river, which formed more than 300 lakes and swamps including Lake Inawashiro and Lake Hibara of Urabandai.





The Goshikinuma Natural Trail of about 4 km in total length is maintained to enjoy a group of more than 10 lakes and swamps of Goshikinuma. The color of water changes depending on the weather and time of a visit, which makes people want to return repeatedly.

13 | Oguninuma Swamp








14 | Mt. Adatara


