

Winter ART colours Exhibition Scheduled at Park Hotel Tokyo to Offer Guests with Japanese Aesthetics of Season

Born in Kanagawa Prefecture, 1984.

Last year was Becky's 20th anniversary since her debut as a tv personality/actress.

In 2020 she will appear in Mr. Takeshi Miike's film, "First Love". She also works as the MC in the popular television program, "Ainori", which is approaching its

third season. Her portfolio includes diverse engagements in the fields of television, film, radio, magazines, and commercials.

In 2017 she has joined an art project, "10,000yen Art", which was setup by the broadcast writer, Mr. Mitsuyoshi Takasu. With this experience, she became interested in the world of art and started drawing. In December of the same year, she began contributing her drawings on a monthly basis to the serial publication, "InRed", published by Takarajimasha.

Last year, starting with "NEWoMan ART wall (Tokyo)", she held her first solo-exhibition titled, "To the sky", in Osaka and Fukuoka Prefectures.

This will be her second solo-exhibition.
