◆ *Spiraea salicifolia* (Hozakishimotsuke)

It was intense heat at the end of June, but Okunikko has regained its usual cool weather. Sometimes it feels chilly in the morning and evening. *Spiraea salicifolia* (Hozakishimotsuke), which represents summer in Senjogahara moor, is in bloom.

◆ *Lonicera racilipes var. glabra* (Miyama-uguisukagura)

The fruits of Miyama-uguisukagura hanging from the branches shine like rubies in the sunlight. It is refreshing to feel the summer of highlands with all five senses.

◆ Be aware of bear

Asian black bear was seen at the Yumoto campsite, at the parking lot next to Ryuzu Falls and on the national highway nearby. Bears inhabit the entire Okunikko area. If you see a bear, you should leave immediately without provoking it.
