The Yutaki parking lot, which had been closed in winter, was opened on April 4th, and many tourists have visited to Yutaki Falls.
On the following day, April 5th, a walking trail on the east side of Lake Yunoko has opened, allowing visitors to enjoy an easy stroll.
At midnight on April 8th, snow was falling in Yumoto.
Rhododendron pentaphyllum (Akayashio) bloomed on Iroha slope. Also, the weeping cherry tree at Tamozawa Imperial Villa Memorial Park is at their best.
It will be interesting to see how the blooming continues.
