● Nature

The speed of blooming seems to be slowing down, probably due to the recent lack of warmer temperatures. The Japanese primroses usually bloom at the Shobugahama beach earlier than the Senjugahama beach, but even at the Shobugahama beach, the blooms are still just before their best time to be seen. Some of the Malus toringos in Senjogahara moor are already in full bloom, but there are individual differences. Many of them are just after blooming, so they must be still beautifully bloomed even after the rain. The Cotton grasses have increased since the previous week, but are still far from their best time to be seen. At Lake Yunoko, the Enkianthus campanulatuses are still in full bloom. In the past week or so, we have been hearing more and more of the Terpnosia nigricosta sounds, and it is very lively during the daytime.
