### 2024 Climbing Restrictions on the Mt. Fuji Yoshida Trail

We would like to thank you for your cooperation and continuous support in the conservation of the World Heritage Site Mt. Fuji. In regards to the ascent of Mt. Fuji in 2023, numerous climbers hoped to witness the sunrise at the summit and thus ascended during the night, leading to a significant amount of congestion and climbers ascending the mountain without any rest.

Henceforth, gates will be installed at the fifth station on the Yoshida trail from 2024 onwards and the following restrictions will be enforced.

#### Climbing restrictions at the fifth station on the Yoshida Trail from 2024 onwards

- Regulatory period: 1<sup>st</sup> July to 10<sup>th</sup> September
- Restricted hours: 16:00 to 3:00 (※Individuals with mountain hut reservations are exempt)
- Maximum number of climbers: 4,000 people per day(※Individuals with mountain hut reservations are exempt)
- Hiking Fee: 2,000 Yen each time(※Alongside the Fujisan Conservation donation (1,000 yen) which was previously implemented, the maximum fee for each person will be 3,000 yen.)

#### Yamanashi Prefecture Mt. Fuji Yoshida trail gate entrance reservation system

Climbers can make prior reservations to climb Mt. Fuji, with the hiking fee being paid at the time of reservation.

Please note that this is the reservation for general admission through the trail gate (mandatory) and not a reservation for the mountain huts.
