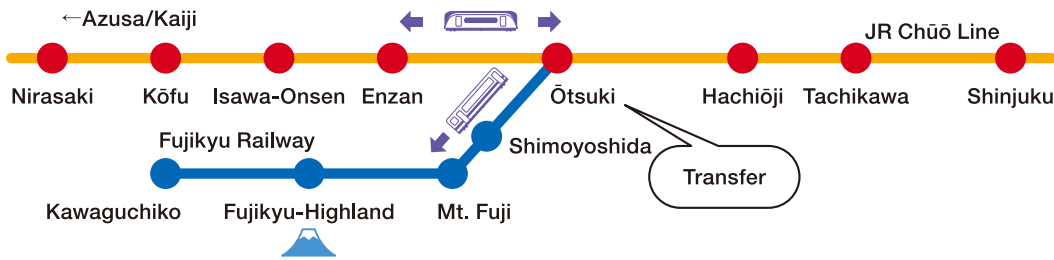


For passengers traveling toward Mt. Fuji/Lake Kawaguchi

FUJIKYU 2-Day Rail Pass

This ticket allows unlimited rides on Fujikyu Railway (between Ōtsuki and Kawaguchiko) local trains for two days.

*FUJI EXCURSION, FUJISAN VIEW EXPRESS, Fujisan Express, and other express trains require a separate express or other ticket.
*Only available as an e-ticket.

Restrictions on climbing Mt. Fuji by the Yamanashi Prefectural Government

There are restrictions on climbing Mt. Fuji via the Yoshida Trail. During the climbing season (July 1–September 10, 2024), when passing through the gate at the fifth station, **it will also be necessary to pay a fee of up to ¥3,000 per person (¥2,000 hiking fee + optional ¥1,000 Mt. Fuji conservation donation).** For information about these restrictions, please see the official website for climbing Mt. Fuji.



Suica cards can also be used to pay hiking fees, etc. on Mt. Fuji. Remember to charge your card in advance.

Grilled chicken thighs Sennari

● Approx. 7 minutes' walk from Kōfu Station, JR Chūō Line
This restaurant was established in 1966 and specializes in *yakitori* grilled chicken using real charcoal.
Their charcoal-grilled chicken thighs are soft and juicy!



Koshu nigiri Sushidokoro Uoyasu

● Approx. 15 minutes by bus from Kōfu Station, JR Chūō Line
Only in Yamanashi!
Extra-large sushi served with a sweet sauce.



Koshu chicken ramen Chicken Soba Akari

● Approx. 5 minutes' walk from Kōfu Station, JR Chūō Line
Their dish of rich *tori paitan* (chicken broth) noodles is popular and full of umami flavor from simmered whole Koshu chicken.

A location for connoisseurs Yokocho



Chochin Yokocho by Kōfu Station

● Approx. 5 minutes' walk from Kōfu Station, JR Chūō Line
Red *chochin* lanterns create a magical atmosphere in this traditional drinking district, which is lined with a variety of eateries, including Japanese *izakaya* and western-style bars.



Americaya Yokocho

● Approx. 2 minutes' walk from Nirasaki Station, JR Chūō Line
This is a nostalgic street of renovated old rowhouses, which are home to a selection of restaurants serving Nirasaki cuisine. It is also the perfect place to go barhopping.

Souvenirs unique to Yamanashi!

Japanese sake

Sasaichi Sake Brewery

● Approx. 4 minutes' walk from Sasago Station, JR Chūō Line
The Sasaichi Sake Brewery is one of Yamanashi's most renowned sake breweries and its signature sake brand is also called Sasaichi. The sakes in this range have a nuanced taste and are brewed using pure groundwater that flows from Mt. Fuji.



Koshu washi

● Approx. 4 minutes' walk from Kōfu Station, JR Chūō Line

Here you can find a wide range of charming merchandise and souvenirs that utilize special locally-produced *washi*, handmade Japanese paper with a 1,000-year history.



Koshu Miso

Itutuya Soy Sauce Co., Ltd.

● Approx. 8 minutes' walk from Nirasaki Station, JR Chūō Line

Itutuya's Koshu Miso uses soybeans from Yamanashi Prefecture, malted rice, and barley *koji* mold. This delicacy has been certified by Yamanashi Prefecture as a regional specialty that capitalizes on the goodness of local ingredients.

Café & Wine Bar Budoshu Ichibankan, CELEO KOFU

Here you can casually enjoy drinking wines from Yamanashi Prefecture. The souvenirs are also highly recommended.
